Tutoring consists of 30 to 60 minutes per day in small groups. On-going support may occur with subsequent assessment. 17 and 18 year old EAL students must pass grade 10 or show language proficiency to enter grades 11 and 12 and may require 3 to 4 years to graduate. Tuition is required for international students, children of Provincial Nominees w/o status or on work/study permits.
