Education and Our Future: A road map to Innovation and Excellence (2007)	Teacher Allocation Commission		This report reviewing teacher allocations in NL mentions ESL and raises concerns about the itinerant teacher model and the number of schools requiring services, the teaching time lost to travel, the number of students required before the allocation of more teachers, the lack of differentiation of resources by age or grade of student, and the fact that ESL allocations are not based on the previous years enrollment.
