

Writing Puzzle: A Good Friend

Write a short composition (about 100 words) about this topic, including **two** sentences from List A and **two** from List B. If necessary you may adjust those sentences slightly, so as to make their grammar fit into your composition, but you must make only small changes and you **must not change the meaning of any of the sentences that you choose**.

Because you are using sentences from both lists, your composition will contain different views about the topic. You must find a way to express your own opinion while also taking account of differing views.

Write the sentence number – (1), (2), etc – before each sentence you choose, wherever it appears in your composition. You do **not** need to use the sentences in the order by which they are numbered in the lists.

List A

1. A good friend always agrees with you and supports you.
2. A true friend stands up for you whenever you are in trouble.
3. A true friend will not let anyone say anything bad about you.
4. A good friend never tells you that you have made a mistake.

List B

5. A good friend always tells you the truth.
6. A true friend disagrees with you when you are wrong.
7. A good friend answers your questions honestly.
8. A true friend gives you good advice.
